ATLAS.ti licence renewed

The licence has been automatically extended until 28 March 2024. The invite key has remained the same.

ATLAS.ti 23

Version 23.1.1 of ATLAS.ti was recently released. The latest version includes two optional beta features, which do come with a warning.

- Each user gets 100 MB of free storage to store projects in the cloud. This is not intended for working simultaneously with several people on the same project, the <u>web version</u> is for that. For more information see: <u>Project Cloud</u>.
- <u>Al coding</u> based on GPT from OpenAI. This involves sending project data to the US company OpenAI. As also stated in the License Agreement, it is **not allowed** to use this function with data containing personal information.

Warning: beta functions may malfunction, change, get a paid variant or disappear. Please pay close attention to privacy and security aspects yourself.

Safe use of ATLAS.ti for research

- Use THUAS computers, where the hard disk is protected with BitLocker.
- First anonymise research data before analysing it with ATLAS.ti.
- Projects can possibly be <u>password</u>-protected (but if you lose that, you also lose access to the project!)
- Make a backup after each longer work session by exporting the project (File → Export →
 Project bundle). Save the file externally e.g. OneDrive; researchers can also use Research
 Drive.

Installing on THUAS laptops

For THUAS laptops, ATLAS.ti 23 is not yet available, but version 22.2.5.0 Windows is.

Backup

If you are using an older version of ATLAS.ti and want to update, always make a backup of all projects beforehand.

• In ATLAS.ti, from any open project, go to: File and choose: Export → Project bundle.

Install

- Close ATLAS.ti if the programme was still open.
- Click Windows Start and go to: Microsoft Endpoint Manager. Choose Software Center and then click ATLAS.ti 22.2.5.0.
