



# Vacancy: Student project leaders for the student organisation Arbitras

The research group Multilevel Regulation, chaired by Dr. Barbara Warwas, is looking for four highly motivated students to perform the tasks of:

- Vacancy 1: Student project leader for Arbitras (events)
- Vacancy 2: Student project leader for Arbitras (communications)
- Vacancy 3: Student project leader for Arbitras (editor-in-chief blog posts)
- Vacancy 4: Student project leader for Arbitras (editor-in-chief of the ADR Gazette)

## What is the research group and what do we do?

We are one of the research groups at the Centre of Expertise Global and Inclusive Learning. Our role is to conduct research that is relevant for education, society, and the professional practice. The research group Multilevel Regulation continues to implement its Manifesto, that is: ADR for the 99%! ADR stands for Alternative Dispute Resolution, which means a broad array of dispute resolutions practices (e.g., buurtbemiddeling – community mediation in The Netherlands, currently used in 85% of Dutch municipalities), all having real impact on people's daily and professional lives. The group continues to study multilevel regulation through the study of ADR.

We are now looking for student project leaders who would coordinate and shape our student projects led by Arbitras.

### What is Arbitras and its student-led projects?

Arbitras is a student-led initiative that aims to connect students, academics, and professionals to promote the use and knowledge of dispute resolution. The organization has 4 projects:

- 1. Blog posts
- 2. Events
- 3. Podcast
- 4. ADR Gazette

# Who are we looking for?

The applicant would ideally be in their 4th year of studies, but motivated 3rd and 2nd year students will be considered. They must have a strong interest in dispute resolution and be highly motivated to coordinate a student-led organisation at THUAS to help it grow further. The position will be performed in English, but a good working knowledge of Dutch is welcome. If your study programme allows this, the position could be performed as an internship (please check with an internship coordinator of your study programme before applying).



The student project leaders will be active members of the research group Multilevel Regulation where they will work under the supervision of Ms. Amanda Kemshaw and Dr. Barbara Warwas and occasionally also other researchers-lecturers.

#### The ideal candidate:

For Vacancy 1, we are looking for candidates with excellent organisation skills.

For Vacancy 2, we're looking for candidates with excellent communication skills.

For Vacancy 3 and 4, we're looking for candidates with excellent writing and editing skills.

Generally, all candidates should demonstrate some prior experience in project coordination.

#### Are you interested?

The position is for 8 hours per week (0.2 FTE). It is to begin as soon as possible. The position is initially for six months, with a possibility of extension subject to performance and the needs of Arbitras and the research group. The remuneration is in accordance with the applicable provisions of the HBO CAO Agreement (around 360 EUR per month).
